3. Adding Elders (MX Church Leadership Structure)

After discussion noted below consensus was reached that the Elders should approach four (4) men to see if they are willing to attend the Elder meetings and shadow the elders for 6-12 months. Then, if mutually agreeable, they will be presented to the congregation for possible commissioning as an elder. The men were selected from the initial list submitted by the Elders earlier in the week (see Attachment B). The four men are: Jon Earnhart, Steve Jones, Collins Corder, and Charles Eickele.

We also agreed that there should be leadership development, two tracks: 1) one for those men who we see as possible future candidates for joining the elders, and 2) another group of those in the body who are currently leading or have the qualities of leadership (included women like Kari Ferguson).

Below were discussion items to help define the goal/outcome of eldership number and composition. Additional questions/thoughts from Bret noted in Attachment C.

- How many elders do we need?
 - <u>Dave Weiler</u> more members on a non-profit board is better. Feels similar to eldership IF we use sub-committees: Finance, Pastoral, Vision
 - Do we have a roadmap [Steve Walker]

- What qualities are we looking for to balance us as an eldership?
 - We have a need for Pastoral elders to work with Keaton (many of the possible new elders have good qualities for this)
 - o Keaton likes younger elders for a different perspective
 - Are young professionals and families comfortable with the direction of the church? Do we get eldership representation for/from them?
 - <u>Don Fitzgerald</u> wishes we had more specifics about what elders did in the first century. What are we looking for in a new elder? What skillset to complement the current elders? We have uncertainty to what we are calling someone to when they are commissioned as an elder here at MX.
 - Admin Committee [<u>Dave Weiler</u>] involves many people, more than just the elders. What if the Vision Committee were 2-3 elders plus a couple individuals from the congregation? Same with other Committees.
 - Jeff Kryder Leadership development is important. How do we grow the pool and encourage those to seek the position of eldership. How do we encourage ministry leaders? Are we giving members a calling?
 - <u>Steve Walker</u> Can we still give members a task, challenge them to step in. Perhaps NOT as an elder but to take the lead or work with a task to help further the kingdom.
 - After Covid there seems to be a feeling of instability. Is the MX Leadership just trying to keep the plates spinning?
 - What do we need for the next 2-3 years? Who do we have now to help is in the next 2-3 years? How do we call them to step up?
 - Whatever we do we need to communicate it to the congregation.
 - Jeff Kryder buy-in will increase when congregation gets involved. There are a lot of skillsets in our congregation. How do we bring these to bear, to leverage these to help the congregation?
 - 1. What is the Leadership mission?
 - 2. Do we need a weeknight to bring talented and spiritual members together to discuss and pray about the mission of MX? Target people, challenge them, and give them something worth their while.
 - 3. Erich McPherson influences people but not through the normal channels. Meaning, are Elders leading the sheep or are the sheep taking lead from someone else?
 - 4. Don Fitz do we need to look at an elder/deacon type model? Elder mission leader connections. As we discuss leadership training it sounds like deacons.
 - Dave Weiler would we be helped from the Serving And Leading Together (SALT) team concept? Link <u>here</u>
 - List of Possible Elders:
 - Are there initial qualifications for being on the list? Children? Divorced? Position on marriage, etc.?
 - We probably want three lists:

To Whom This Concerns,

I have been dragging my feet on writing this because of my close relationship with the Strickland family, Carrie and I even grew up at McKnight together, and putting this friendship at risk causes me tremendous anxiety. But, my kids are my utmost priority, and therefore I have no choice but to voice my concerns. I adore Nathan Strickland as a person, a kind and funny soul, and a buddy to my kids, but I have concerns over him becoming the youth minister. Nathan is young, inexperienced, and has little idea of what being a youth minister entails (nor could anyone until they are in the midst of it all), which is the exact situation we, as youth group families, already experienced with Michalie. Though, to be fair, I cannot predict the fated outcome of this hypothetical situation, we are in a place now where our kids need and deserve stability, they need to know they have that safety net in a youth minister without the concern over yet another possible loss. If Nathan were to be hired this will be my son, Coen's, fourth youth minister in five years and I think we, and all of the youth group families, have been fairly patient and trusting in the leadership but now is not the time to bring in someone new and bring about more change. I, personally, had a chance to speak with Jeremy on the Middle School mission trip and was not only impressed with the way he taught, prayed with, joked with, and cared for the kids during the trip, I was also impressed with the way he has established relationships with the families of those in the youth group. He has reached out to families and has more middle school and high school youth and their families wanting to get involved. Jeremy has gained the trust of the kids and their families (especially middle school families who were not participating before he took over). Jeremy enjoys the job, is not a "flight risk", and has proved his dedication to our kids and the job of being youth minister. Basically, it simply comes down to what is in the best interest of the pre-teens and teens at McKnight and who can be trusted with the responsibility of achieving this best interest of all involved.

I realize you have many opinions to hear on this issue and I am only one but I have a request, please make this decision swiftly. We have all been through a lot and it really isn't fair to drag this out much longer, as we have much to discuss as a family and would like to be settled before the school year begins. Thank you for your time.

"I know we will have push back on Eric & Jayson because they both dealt with divorce. I feel God's forgiveness covers that and does not necessarily disqualify them from serving as elders."

"I know we would need to confront the "can't be divorced" deal). Eric cares way too much to be on the sidelines".

"I think we should consider allowing the congregation to tell us who is a good fit."

Here is a summary from the May 3, 2021 meeting notes (link *here* and a companion website *here*) :

<u>Conclusion</u>: The de facto standard has been that divorce excludes a man from Elder selection. The articles reviewed and associated discussion did not present a clear and compelling reason to change direction on this position and consensus agreement remains that an Elder should not have been divorced.

Although there was consensus on the conclusion we realize there is nuance in the passages that keeps them from being clearly black and white. Both sides of the position were discussed. However, one theme that we returned to in our discussion was that of the many listed qualifications of an elder that the marriage covenant is a sacred thing, and not to be taken lightly.

Gents,

I should start by stating that unless there is a compelling reason to add elders I am opposed to doing so.

As I stated in the last elder meeting, I think there should be 5-8 elders. When the number of elders gets below 8 or 9 that should be a trigger event to bring in a candidate (or two) to work along side the elders for a time before deciding about confirmation. I do not think it best to invite anyone to apprentice before this point.

We currently have 10 elders so I do not feel motivated to make adding elders a priority. Sure, there are a couple who will retire soon and a few that may take ill, but we have time for that to play out. As stated above, we could lose 5 for various reasons and I would still be good with only having 5 active elders.

I think of possible elders in two categories -a) those who seems ready to quickly join the group and b) those who may be young or not quite eligible (age of children, newness to congregation, etc.). For both I think it appropriate and good if we the elders began praying over the list and encouraging these men (without making any future offers).

Here are my lists:

Group A-I believe the following men have the qualifications to fold into the eldership after a minimal trial period:

- Jon Earnhart
- Jeff Goff
- Jeff McGlawn

Group $\mathbf{B} - \mathbf{I}$ see potential in these men; however, their children may be young.

- Matthew Bardewell
- Ross Brown

I am very comfortable with the elders composing a similar list of men to start praying over them. Anything beyond that makes me uncomfortable.
