- Lead Worshipper on Sunday mornings, and other occasions, as needed. Able to lead both acapella and instrumental worship.
 - o Able to passionately lead the Praise Team and the congregation into the throne room of the Holy God
- **Develop Worship Team** Recruit and develop those participating on the Worship Team through rehearsals, teaching music, teaching new songs, blending voices, and instruments, to enable an encounter with God and Christ in corporate worship.
- Planning and Administration of Order of Worship
 - o Actively manage coordination, planning, and schedules of worship leaders, praise team singers, and instrumentalists, for each worship time.
 - Coordinate worship participants for all aspects of worship (Announcements, Prayers, Communion Thoughts, Scripture Readers, etc.)
 - o Responsible for readiness of all details and personnel for practices and times of worship, including ProPresenter preparation, sound and mic setup, and live-stream readiness.

At the March 6, 2023 elder meeting Audrie presented a clothing ministry she would like to start at the McKnight building. Her vision is to be able to provide shoes and clothing, and eventually bedding/linens, to individuals on the same schedule that the food pantry (<u>https://www.mxchurch.org/christians-who-carefood-pantry</u>) is open. Audrie would like room to store 12 large totes of clothes and possibly wants a clothing drop-box for the parking lot. Audrie also indicated she has discussed her plans with Barb Eickele, who is on-board with the project.

There was some discussion that this may be an overly ambitious plan, and perhaps we should start with a focus on children's clothes, or baby needs. Others mentioned we should find a way to gauge the need for a clothing pantry in our area.

Bret mentioned that other ministries are serving this need and perhaps it is best to partner with them instead of trying to build another competing ministry. MX has relationships with the Webster-Rockhill Ministries (<u>https://www.wrhm.org/</u>) as well as Churches on the Street (<u>https://www.churchesonthestreets.com/</u>). There is also a Goodwill less than a mile away.

Although I do not consider this a ministry that MX should start, I very much want to honor Audrie's heart and desire to help others. My suggestion is that we channel this energy and passion into a way that MX can partner with other ministries currently working in this space.

Special Days – Lent, Easter, Christmas, etc.

There was some time taken at the March 6, 2023 Elder meeting to discuss the appropriateness of recognizing specific holidays during Sunday worship, holidays like - Lent, Easter, Advent, Christmas, etc.

The concern seems to be that pagan holidays have been co-opted as Christian religious festivals. That our Sundays may end up with trappings of Santa Claus and trees, or Easter bunnies and chocolate, and miss the central themes of the gospel. Although this is a valid concern, and can be seen in several religious organizations, it does not appear to be a problem at McKnight Crossings (MX). Christ has always been central to our worship, especially on those Sunday's where we celebrate and remember the birth and death/resurrection of our Lord.

It was shared that the old and New Testament are filled with examples of special days and tokens of remembrances (piles of stones, festival of booths, Passover, etc. & etc.).

A couple conflicting Bible verses:

Galatians 4:9-10

But now that you know God—or rather are known by God—how is it that you are turning back to those weak and miserable forces^[2]? Do you wish to be enslaved by them all over again? You are observing special days and months and seasons and years!

Colossians 2:16-17

Therefore, do not let anyone judge you by what you eat or drink, or with regard to a religious festival, a New Moon celebration or a Sabbath day. These are a shadow of the things that were to come; the reality, however, is found in Christ.
