## **Expanding our Support Base**

We are energized by expanding our support base. Rooftop Community Church has become a new monthly supporter! We are always looking to add groups who share our common mission of serving our community's needs.

## Selah Living Update

#### Many have no one, Be their someone.

For over 50 years, our faithful supporters have been "their someone". The last few years have been some of the strongest years financially for CFS. That has allowed us to expand our services into Transitional Housing called "Selah Living". Selah is a Hebrew word meaning to pause and lift up. We hope to provide families in crisis with a place to pause and rest and recover. Then, as partners together, we lift them up to self-sufficiency. We have added 2 new Selah Living clients in 2022. We are incredibly excited about this new opportunity!

## **Pregnancy Support Impact Story**

Lisa came to CFS on advice from her friend. Lisa had been in prison for much of her life due to drug use and had recently discovered she was pregnant. When she reached out to CFS, she was living in sub-standard housing with Mike, the father of the baby. Mike had also been in and out of jail.

Lisa delivered her baby girl, Maya, soon after beginning services with CFS. Unfortunately, Maya was a victim of contaminated formula which caused her to be rushed to the hospital for a failure to thrive. Once treated, Maya continued to be at-risk due to formula shortages. Lisa relied heavily on CFS to provide the much-needed formula that could not be found in stores.

While working with CFS, Lisa completed parenting classes and health and development education classes. Both Lisa and Mike proved to be hard workers, showing a determination to better their situation and provide a stable home for Maya.

Today, Maya is a happy and healthy one-year-old. With CFS assistance, Lisa, Maya, and Mike are in safe housing. Lisa and Mike now work jobs they love and have maintained sobriety. Both Lisa and Mike credit CFS with being the support they needed at the time they needed help most.
