This Friday a small group of us will head down to camp for Staff Training. We'll leave at 5:30pm from the church building!




Sunday | Mar 3

The 5 Series

Most recent 5 Series post: 5 Reasons Why the New Testament is Reliable

- 1. It's reasonable to believe that most, if not all of the NT was written before AD 70. The Jewish Temple in Jerusalem was destroyed in AD 70, and no NT writers even mention it. This could be compared to if you were to write about the 2000s and not mention September 11th, or to write about the 2020s and not mention the Coronavirus pandemic.
- 2. There are about 10 non-Christian sources who mention Jesus within 150 years of his life. Why? They would gain nothing from mentioning him. They had no motivation to do so. Roman-Jewish historian, Flavius Josephus (AD 37-100), wrote what we call "The Testimonium Flavianum," that describes the crucifixion of Jesus at the hands of Roman authorities.
- 3. The disciples share stories about themselves that you and I wouldn't share if we wanted to look good. They failed to understand what Jesus was saying, they fell asleep when Jesus needed them to pray, Jesus says to Peter "Get behind me Satan," Peter denied Jesus 3 times, they hid when Jesus went to the cross, etc. Why include these details unless they were true?
- 4. Talk about things that no one wants to hear. Look at the Sermon on the Mount. When someone strikes our right cheek, we want to strike theirs back. We don't want to

love our enemies or pray for them. We want to store up treasures for ourselves. Jesus spoke on all these things. If you were making up a fake figure for people to follow, you'd have him say things that affirm the way people live so people would want to follow him, not say things that convict people.

5. The Gospel writers have different details in their books that people use to invalidate the truth of scripture. "Matthew and John differ on how many angels were at Jesus' tomb." What did they agree on? There were angels, at least one, at Jesus' tomb. What about the Titanic? Different news sources reported different numbers of deaths. People explained different ways in which the boat sank -- did it break in half and then sink? Did it go straight down? But what's the thing people agreed on? It sank.
