2. New Members: It was decided that those wishing to place membership will be allowed to do so. However, they will need to go through the *Next Steps* class to be recognized as a baptized believer and full member.

Recent inquiries into membership – Sandra Lumpkin, Dina Hill, and David Morris.

- **3. 2025 Budget:** The Administrative Elders are working on the 2025 budget. We remain \$90k under budget for 2024 but hope for some additional giving in December.
- **4. Q1 2025 Preaching Schedule**: Steve Awtrey discussing possibilities with the elders. Jerry Jones did a great job and we are considering bringing Jerry back in 2025. Several others are getting lined-up to preach as well with topics under development.

5. Administrative Minister:

Administration has been noted as a concern with many of the ministerial candidates. It is also an area that continues to need attention in the absence of Jeff Kryder. To fill this gap, the elders have hired Steve Walker to take on the role of a part-time Administrative Minister.

<u>Note</u>: The discussion of Steve remaining as a voting elder was discussed. The potential conflict was recognized and discussed but a majority of those in attendance felt it was not only appropriate but preferable for Steve to remain an elder even while working as a paid minister.

- **6. Bible Classes:** Although a committee has been working on Bible classes (is this the Christian Formation group?), all schedules and curriculum needs to be presented to the elders for review prior to implementation. The Q1 2025 plan is now under development (possibly 3 classes) and Jeff McGlawn should have a recommendation to bring to the elders soon.
- **7. Hospitality:** Steve Awtrey mentioned the importance of the elders modeling hospitality. Trying to find ways to get smaller groups of the congregation in our homes or provide other opportunities for fellowship.

Hospitality is considered a topic for preaching in January & February 2025.

LGBTQ+ Conversation (key item from prior mtgs)

Steve Walker shared the Rooftop Community Church Statement on Gender and Sexuality.

Although "marriage" is mentioned in the McKnight Crossings Church of Christ Core Beliefs (<u>Facility</u> <u>Rental Agreement (mxcoc.xyz)</u>). However, this is not on our website but has in the past been distributed to ministry leaders to affirm during budget submission.

It was discussed if Dave Weiler could present his thoughts on the Church and LGBTQ+, based on his recent study in this area. The Elders can then decide what, if anything, might be needed as far as a formal position on the matter. This should be done prior to a new minister as to avoid any suspicion that it was done on his request or prompting.

Other earlier discussions on the topic:

July 10, 2023 notes:

<u>LGBTQ+ discussion</u> – Dave Weiler mentioned study with Brian Hill and Bret Blackford on Sundays after worship. Brian Hill has a homosexual uncle and uncle asked McKnight's position on the matter. Dave Weiler explained that McKnight's position is that a marriage recognized by God is one man and one woman for life, but that homosexuals and those on the LGBTQ+ spectrum should be welcome to worship with the McKnight body.
